WARNING SIGNS

Storing and taking high daily doses of prescription opioids.

Uncontrollable cravings and weight fluctuations.

Drowsiness and changes in sleep habits and hygiene.

PREVENTION TIPS

Talk to your doctor about ways to manage pain without use of opioids.

Store prescriptions in a locked, secure place and keep track of use.

Instruct your child to only take medicines given to them by you or a trusted adult. Remind them to never take anyone else's medicine.

Safely dispose or destroy expired or no longer needed prescription medication.
